## **Learn CPR at the Fair in < 30 minutes**

Who: Iowa CPR Education Foundation

What: Free CPR to the public

Where: Wellmark Blue Cross Blue Shield Stage

When: Aug 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> 2006

Times: from 1000am-Noon on both days

The local chapter of the American Heart Association, in collaboration with Mercy Medical Center, Iowa Health System and the Iowa CPR Education Foundation, will present Free CPR classes for the public during two days of the Iowa State Fair. August 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> from 1000am to noon on both days at the Wellmark Blue Cross Blue Shield Stage. This will not be a certified course but the participants will have plenty of time to practice and learn CPR in less than thirty minutes.

Approximately 350,000 Americans die annually of cardiovascular disease and sudden cardiac arrest – before reaching the hospital. Many of these lives could be saved by training community members in CPR. While CPR and Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) training is mandatory for first responders, childcare professionals and other healthcare providers, the general public has few opportunities to attend CPR Courses. This year's Free CPR Classes target audience is parents, children, grandparents, family or friends of individuals with a high risk for cardiac disease and individuals that desire to learn CPR and practice the skills. These individuals can make a large impact on the survival of sudden cardiac arrest victims and will most likely help if the situation occurs.

This will be our second year putting this event on at the fair. Victims, of sudden cardiac arrest, have a four times improvement in survival than victim who do not receive CPR. So, bring your family and friends to learn the new 30:2 adult CPR. This is not a certified course. This will be all hands on skills. Each family will receive a New "CPR Anytime" for Family and Friends course kit, while supplies last. This will allow the family to take this back home and practice with there family and friends over and over. This is a \$30.00 value.
